MB High School Diploma

- 30 credits (Grades 9 12) required to graduate
 - Total compulsory courses = 17
 - Total elective courses = 13
- Each course = 1 credit
- Goal for Grade 9 is to attain 8 credits
 - Math
 - ELA
 - Science
 - Social Studies
 - Technical Communication
 - Physical Education/Health
 - 2 electives (Art, Band, French, Human Ecology, Tech Ed.)
- Goal for Grade 10 is to attain a minimum of 10 credits
- Complete additional 12 or more credits in grades 11/12

French Immersion students can take Intro to Applied & Pre-Calculus Math as an elective.



Grade 10 Math Options

1) Introduction to Applied and Pre-Calculus Math

Provides students with the mathematical understandings and critical-thinking skills identified for post-secondary studies. Students will choose to continue with Applied or Pre-Calculus stream upon completion of Grade 10 credit.

Recommended minimum Grade 9 math mark = 75%

2) Essential Math

Provides students with the mathematical understandings and critical-thinking skills identified for entry into some post-secondary studies, the majority of trades, and for direct entry into the work force.

Students can take both Grade 10 math courses. Second math course would count as an elective.



Grade 10 Math Options - Unsure???

Ask your Grade 9 Math teacher for their input - they will have the best insight into your mathematical abilities!!!

Questions to help you determine whether you are prepared for Grade 10 Intro to Applied & Pre-Calculus:

- What is my level of success with the Grade 9 outcomes specifically geared towards Applied & Pre-Calculus math?
- Do I have a positive attitude towards math?
- Do I have a strong work ethic in math?



Grade 10 Enriched Courses

Provide a challenge for students who are highly motivated, willing to persevere and enjoy the subject area.

Students go deeper into their learning and gain knowledge and skills to apply to future coursework including post-secondary education.

- Enriched Math 20S minimum mark of 85% in Grade 9 Math
- Enriched English 20S minimum mark of 85% in Grade 9 ELA
- Enriched Science 20S minimum marks of 85% in Grade 9 Math and Science

A student can choose to take one, two, or all three enriched courses.



Indigenous Student Centre

- Provides cultural and academic support for our Indigenous students
- Utilizes education and understanding of Indigenous perspectives to make connections with our youth to achieve Mino-Bimaadiziwin (the good life)
- Students are provided with leadership opportunities in the school and their community through P.A.S.S. (Promoting Aboriginal Student Success)
- Supported by two classroom teachers and our Indigenous Counsellor



Flexible Education

- For students that need more flexibility with their programming and/or learning environment
- Students may take one or more courses in our Flexible Education program
 - On-site at the Comp
 - Off-site through the Lord Selkirk Education Centre
- Students in our Flexible Education classrooms may access the following:

Satellite learning/medical remote learning

Credit recovery

Full credit courses

School/grad/life/career planning

Well-being supports

Cultural connections/Indigenous perspectives

- A before-school hockey program offered at the grade 9, 10 and 11 level where students can learn about all aspects of the game while also earning high school credits. Student can achieve credit at all three levels.
- Available to Grades 9-12 students in the Lord Selkirk School Division
- Lead by Mike Buffie & Jason Bauer, two teachers at the Comp, who have extensive experience coaching hockey as well as operating/coaching at hockey academies
- Program takes place during first semester (September 2023 February 2024)
 - Odd Days 20 players (Group A)
 - Even Days 20 players (Group B)
 - 7:30 a.m. 8:30 a.m. ice time at Selkirk Recreation Complex
 - Parent/guardian responsible for drop-off
 - 8:45 a.m. Bus shuttle to schools for start of school day
- Cost per player is approximately \$350


